child and more as I matured into an adult - oh, so very irritating and annoving, being at the receiving end of that phrase. It was one of my Dad's favorite sayings. He must have said it a LOT because he heard the "I Can't" a LOT of times from me and my siblings. Somehow the "I Can't" seemed to be one of my favorite sayings and most often when it was something I couldn't believe I could do or didn't want to do. As my siblings and I got older, our comebacks became a bit more sophisticated. "Dad, you know the word, 'can't,' IS in the dictionary." His response, "It is NOT in MYdictionary." Then there is my favorite as we really began to think of all the things one can't do. So our very next mature response was, "Dad, man CAN'T fly in the air without wings." He did think a few seconds on that one and then smoothly came back with the reply, "Well, man just hasn't figured out how to do that yet - it doesn't mean it can't be done." At about that time, I think I gave up with the excuses. In my Dad's world, there really was no such word as 'can't' - he had defined the standards for his personal success and his gift to me was living this very real truth, his truth, every day.

My Dad was by no means a perfect human being, and there are stories we all tell in the family that we still shake our heads in disbelief. He fell and felt loss and then bounced right back up. He just never gave up. His gift of conviction and high standards set a path for me that has seldom wavered. Today, hearing the "I Can't" is almost like receiving a dare. I know there has to be a way, a solution, and then I am on a mission to find that better choice to figure out how it can work. More importantly, the cornerstone for me has become how strongly one believes in themself, their choices and how persistent or intentional they become in their work or goals.

Finding quotes related to personal success has been one of the easier tasks for this newsletter topic as many have had a lot to say about success - what it is, how to achieve it, and even what to do with it. Of course, "success" has many definitions and for it to mean anything, a person has to give it their own individual focus. What success meant to my father is even a bit different than what it means to me and how it shows up in my life today.
